Wraparound Care

We have made the following changes to our provision based on feedback we received from the Wraparound Care survey:

- Increased after-school places from 30 to 35.
- Published an activity timetable, snack menu, club timetable.
- Introduced a new wraparound care email to ensure prompt response to enquiries.
- Introduced new procedures for booking wraparound with Universal Credit or Child Care vouchers.
- Purchased new targeted resources for Key Stage 2.


Our Outdoor Project

With Phase I successful during the last academic year, we are looking ahead at the next three phases of improvements for our outdoor area.

As a reminder, last year, the majority of money was raised by our incredible Friends of Somerdale Educate Together PTA and we were able to improve opportunities including these below:

- A new traversing wall
- Wildlife pond installed
- Climbing boulders added
- Monkey bars installed
- Benches installed
- Den building poles added

Class News

Turtles (Pre-school)



Turtles have had an amazing first term! We have been doing lots of fun group activities such as ribbon dancing, wellie walks, dough disco, and much more. It has been lovely to see the children begin to form friendships, develop their counting skills, and engage really well with our focus text 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' (this has been a particular favourite).

Turtles have also worked super hard to get all the stars in our jar so that we could go to the park for our class treat. Well Done Turtles!

Otters (Reception)

What a busy first term of school Otters have had! Over the last few weeks, we have enjoyed starting our phonics journey and beginning to apply this within our play. Developing meaning to marks is always such an exciting time for the children as they begin to express their thoughts and ideas. We have been working hard on developing hand and finger strength through all kinds of activities.



The children have also enjoyed our focus text, 'Peace at Last,' exploring this book and all the links to the world around us. The children particularly enjoyed the maths link we made last week where we prepared cups of tea (capacity), weighed food for a teddy bears picnic for the bears (mass) and compared beds for the bears (size). Also our link to science, where we explored the moon/sun and Earth.

We have been so busy! Enjoy your half term and I look forward to seeing you all again for more fun and learning in term 2!

Wildcats (Year I)

We have had a great start to the year in Wildcats! We have loved getting stuck in with DT learning about different mechanisms. The children have learnt about sliders and levers and had a go at making each of these. They then designed their own moving picture and made it independently – they look amazing! We have also really enjoyed our history enquiry which took us on a trip to Blaise Castle to look at the old toys. We had a brilliant time and have enjoyed writing postcards about what we got up to!










Hedgehogs (Year 2)

Year 2 has had an exciting and productive term! As part of our enquiry, we've been exploring mapping skills and learning about the physical and human features of our local area. The children put in a great effort, sketching detailed maps of Keynsham, complete with symbols. They also wrote a brief description of our town, using simple geographical terms. 
Bumblebees (Year 3)

This term one of our enquiry questions was based on local geography. We were so impressed with their map skills and questioning of sources of information. Each child wrote a geographer's report based on how the area of Somerdale has changed since the 19th Century. In Learn Together, we have been looking at human rights, wants, needs and children's rights. The children made some posters.



Puffins (Year 4)

Wow, what a busy term we have had, full of amazing learning! We have been **blown away** by the writing in Puffin class, with some great descriptions of The Black Dog and really detailed diary entries based on the short video 'The Catch.' In the last week of term, we have been writing our own short stories as Puffins are keen story writers at the moment. We are aiming to make The Puffin Book of Short Stories and publish this, so stay tuned. We have been conquering some tricky column subtraction with exchanges and Alice and Hannah are so proud of the perseverance and resilience shown. As scientists, we've loved learning about electricity and finished off our unit by making buzz wire games – see pictures below. We may have some budding electricians on our hands.



Elephants (Year 5)


This week has been a busy one for Year 5. Hopefully those of you at home have caught wind of our lithography monoprinting art project.



We learned about artistic hatching for shading, how to use acid to etch onto kitchen foil and have growth mindset as the margin for error was razor thin. This term Year 6 have been learning about taxonomy, how to classify living things. They carried out a mouldy bread investigation when they chose different conditions in which to keep the bread to see when most mould grew. We are a team of Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) from the NHS. We work with children and young people aged 5-18 years to provide early mental health support within schools for mild to moderate mental health difficulties.

1 I:I Sessions

2 Groups

We provide a range of group work to assist young people who are facing similar difficulties
