Class News

Otter Class

Otters' have been exploring our new text, Iris and Isaac. We have discovered Antarctica and all of the amazing animals that live there. Children have investigated weather conditions, where Antarctica is in the world, how the animals there live and so much more.



We linked this to Anti-bullying week and Children in Need by talking about the importance of kindness and sharing. In the story, Iris and Isaac are sad because they can't both fit in the snow nest they had made. So, after receiving a letter from Iris asking us for help, the children have been working on how they can create their own snow nests and igloos for Iris and Isaac to share (and did a fantastic job!)

We have also been finding I more and I less this week, which children have very much enjoyed. And exploring all kinds of practical ways of showing I more and I less than, numbers to 5. We have also been practising our number formation, which can be tricky alongside letter formation. But Otters did incredibly well. Well done all!

Wildcats Class

Wildcats have been enjoying getting to know our key text 'Mixed' by Aree Chung. I only gave the children the three primary colours and they had a challenge to mix as many different colours as they could! They then turned these into their own characters like those we see in the book. We have started writing our own versions of 'Mixed' this week and I am excited to read them when they are finished!





Bumblebee Class

This term, we are being historians, focussing on the Stone Age! In our latest session, we learnt about the different tools and even had a go at creating our own models! The children have also shown great engagement within our Learn Together sessions where we are learning all about single-use plastic. This week we investigated one popular supermarket's weekly bulletin, and found that half of the products advertised contained single-use plastic. Next week the children will write a letter to the company to ask them more about this and persuade them to use more sustainable packaging.




Puffin Class

In art, this term, we are looking at exploring pattern. To kickstart this, we looked at creating sensory drawings, inspired by Gillian Adair McFarland. We used pencils and pins to create holes in paper and make beautiful sensory patterns. Everyone loved it and the results were very impressive.

Tiger Class

In science this week, we have been learning about the circulatory system and how blood is pumped around the body. To investigate the components of blood we made a blood 'smoothie' using orange juice (plasma); raspberry (red blood cells); marshmallow (white blood cells) and sprinkles (platelets). We then tasted the smoothie which we agreed was delicious!
