We are delighted with some extremely positive results, including 96% of respondents agreeing that the school has a happy and positive atmosphere, 90% saying their child enjoys school, 93% recognising that we encourage children to care for each other and develop a sense of responsibility, and 92%



#### **Travel Plan and Road Safety**

This year, the Listening Team is supporting two important initiatives to enhance safety and sustainability within our school community. The first is working towards achieving a nationally recognised standard for a school travel plan through the Modeshift Stars Education Scheme. A school travel plan is vital as it promotes safer, healthier, and more environmentally friendly travel options for students, reducing congestion and improving air quality around the school.

The second initiative focuses on improving road safety in and around the school site. The Listening Team will be conducting a survey to identify key areas of concern and will apply for a police grant to fund improved signage and road safety measures, including parking buddies. In addition, they will invite representatives from B&NES council to discuss potential traffic calming solutions, such as a designated road crossing, to help ensure the safety of our pupils and families.

#### **Learning Environment Drive Group**

We set-up a learning environment drive group at the start of the academic year. The aim of the working party was to further enhance the learning environments in Key Stage I & 2. By the end of the project classrooms will have updated layouts and resources to support differentiated learning zones. There was a particular focus on classroom design/physical setup; availability of learning resources; positive/inclusive school culture and ensuring safe and structured environment. The working party considered views of the children reflecting on areas such as cognitive overload. As part of the project the school undertook a successful environmental survey by the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiverstiy in Schools (PINS) project, which was highlighted as best practice at a recent conference.












#### Curriuclum Overviews and Class Timetables:

#### News from around the school

#### **Preschool - Turtles**

This term the Turtles have been thinking about growing, we have planted sunflowers, peas and even have a ceiling high magic beanstalk in the classroom. The children have been fascinated to see the tadpoles continue to develop, they are now all a dappled colour with distinctive eyes but no legs yet. We plan to release them back into the pond before the holiday and the Turtles will be sorry to see them go. The children have done a great job in taking care of their sunflowers, as a result of their diligent watering we now have some very substantial plants. Hopefully, they will survive being planted out and we will be able to continue watching them develop as the summer progresses.



#### **Reception - Otters**

Over this term Otters' have been looking at life cycles and growth. We have been looking at a life-cycle of a frog, habitats and how things grow and change. The last few weeks we have focused on plants, vegetables and flower growth. Comparing size, environment, life cycles and observing changes. Children have enjoyed labelling parts of a flower and doing some planting of their own. We will be monitoring the growth of our newly planted sunflower over the next few weeks with our sunflower diary, before children can bring them home and continue to grow them as tall as they can.



#### Year I - Wildcats

Wildcats have loved exploring the watercolour paints this term! We have found out about an artist called Emma Burleigh who works with watercolour and lives in Bristol. We have followed her videos to learn new watercolour skills and then used them to create our own Spring pictures. We also used the pastels to then add in details to our pictures, creating multi-media artwork. The children thought really carefully about the colours and shapes that they made and the end results have been beautiful!

#### Year 2 - Hedgehogs

This term in Hedgehogs, we've been learning all about how to look after ourselves and our planet! We've explored the serious issue of water pollution by writing our own reports, packed with facts and ideas on how to help protect our oceans and rivers. In Science, we've been busy carrying out experiments to understand the effects of pollution and how we can help reduce it.





#### Year 3 - Bumblebees

This term, our Learn Together focus has been on how to make school a better place. The Bumblebees decided a litter picking station would be best and that it would also ensure a safe environment for children (Article 24) as well as supporting nature. We researched litter picking stations and went out as a class and decided on the best place for this to go. As part of the project, the children also asked Chris to visit during a lesson so they could speak to him about their ideas and to ask permission. Bumblebees will be installing and introducing the litter picking station early next term.

#### Year 4 - Puffin

Puffin Class have had a fantastic term, and we are so proud of their hard work and progress. They have loved reading Danny the Champion of the world and writing their own chapters, as well as instructions for how to successfully poach pheasants. In maths, they have shown a lot of determination as we tackle fractions. As geographers, Puffins have learned all about the course of a river, as scientists they have been exploring states of matter and as designers, they have made their own pencil cases (sewing with 30 children is no small feat and they have been amazingly patient and focused). Alongside this, Puffins have been designing projects to tackle our school's carbon footprint, focusing on food as that was our highest area of carbon emissions. Stay tuned for more information from the children next term.

#### Year 5 - Elephants

In Year 5, we have been busy looking closely at our local area Keynsham and comparing it to Midsomer Norton to recognise the unique features between the two. Whilst we have covered a wide variety of important orientation, map reading and OS survey skills, it is our art topic which has really been the star of the show this week.



#### Year 6 - Tigers
