The Ocean Room is open!

After much anticipation, our new Ocean Room is finally open! A huge thank you to FOSET for your generous donation which meant that we could completely redo the Ocean Room so that it is a purposeful, supportive environment to help meet a wide range of children's sensory needs.

Before the project started, there were a lot of pipes and work to the walls which needed doing. We are very grateful that the RED Construction Group, who are currently completing building work on the Chocolate Quarter, agreed to complete the work for us free of charge- thank you! Through the amazing work that the Friends of Somerdale Educate Together do, they were able to provide us with the complete amount to redo the Ocean Room. On Friday, we were able to finally open the environment and invited FOSET in to be amongst the first to see our new room. The Ocean room consists of the following items:

- Trampoline

Turtles (Pre-School)

We had an amazing dinosaur day this week! We broke them free from the ice, played dinosaur memory games, used the dinosaur feet to make patterns in the dough and enjoyed making lots of dinosaur pictures! The children absolutely loved this day and really got stuck in with all the activities – perhaps we have some future palaeontologists in our class!









Wildcats (Reception)

May 15th was International Water Safety Day, so last week we explored this together We first talked about important ways to stay safe around water. Some examples were always being with an adult, following pool side instructions, not to enter ponds/steams/lakes without adult permission, to use armbands and floats.... This then bought us onto discussing which things sink and which things float and why we use life jackets and armbands. We made predictions as a class after feeling different objects and their weight/size/material before testing them to see which things floated and which sank, and then children enjoyed investigating themselves with items they found around the classroom.



Hedgehogs (Year I)

5 terms down, I to go and what a term it has been! In Hedgehog's we have been making the most of the warmer weather and our new outdoor learning equipment, spending as much time as possible outdoors! This has led to lots of really exciting learning based around our enquiry topic of 'Plants'. Today we finished the term by making grass caterpillars! Please keep these alive with lots of sunlight and water! Any photos of growing caterpillars, please send them in- the funkier the hairstyles the better!







Bumblebees (Year 2)

This term, we've been busy learning new things! This week, since it's been getting warmer, we made ice lollies! We made sure they were healthy by using different types of fruit. In our enquiry lessons, we've been learning about the Great Fire of London. We learned how people tried to put out the fire. To see how it worked, we went outside and made a human water bucket chain. We had a race to see which group could pass the bucket of water the fastest!



Puffins (Year 3)

Goodbye from Caprice! I have had the best couple of terms with your children, it's been great being back with them, the last time I properly taught them, they were in Reception! We've had lots of fun and last week they loved showing and sharing the new outdoor area with me! It's a goodbye for now and hopefully see you all in the park!









Elephants (Year 4)

This week Elephants have been getting sporty with Bristol Sport! We were lucky enough to go to Ashton Gate for Bristol Sports' Celebration of Sport where we tried out six different sports including dodgeball, gymnastics and rugby. It was a fabulous afternoon in the sun – have a look at the pictures!



Leopards (Year 6)

This term's enquiry question has been 'How is the world by impacted by earthquakes and tsunamis?' As part of this learning, the children investigated earthquake-proof buildings around the world. In Design Technology, they designed, created, tested and evaluated their earthquake-proof buildings. They use simple materials such as art straws, paper. Card and lollypop sticks to create their buildings using triangular internal struts. Finally they tested their buildings on a home-made earthquake simulator made by Jess's dad! It has controls to reach 8 on the Richter Scale. Fortunately the children's designed survived the quake thanks to the special features they applied! Well done year 6!



Avon Fire and Rescue Service: Fire and water safety workshop

To help prepare the year 6s for their transition to secondary school and independence, we had a session from Avon Fire and Rescue. The five sessions focussed on smoke alarms, hazards in the home, escape plans, 999 calls, float and flounder and open water hazards. The children had an excellent attitude to all the learning and it could help them save someone's life one day.



Emergency First Aid Training for all at Somerdale

This week we were lucky to have the Wiltshire Air Ambulance in school to give all children emergency first aid training. Andrew, our trainer, spent time in Reception to year 6 focussing on age appropriate first aid that could help your children save a life one day. In year 6 children learned about the phone numbers that can be used and for what purpose: 999, 111 and 112. The App 'What Three Words' is helpful to report location to emergency services if you are in trouble. Children learned how to detect a casualty's breathing and then how to safely put them in the recovery position. If the casualty is not breathing, then the children were able to practise chest compressions on the special mannequins. Then children used a model defibrillator on the mannequin, and we discussed how to safely use them. Finally, children practised back slaps and abdominal thrusts to save someone from choking.



Outdoor Classroom Day

Rain? What rain?! Outdoor Classroom Day was a HUGE success, even with the weather, and the children and staff had a fantastic time outdoors. The activities really developed the resilience of the children and built their growth mindset as they attempted their dens, fire-building, weaving and many other activities – including attempting to collect the Somerdale frog in their net!

Later in the afternoon, we were joined by various VIPs from the local community as well as the Deputy Lord-Lieutenant who attended on His Royal Highness King Charles III's behalf. It was great to see the joy the day provided, and our wonderful staff team are already talking about the possibility of turning it into an annual event.

It was great to see some parents coming around with their children at the end of the day to explore our improved play and learning opportunities outdoors. A massive thank you again to everyone who has made these improvements and the Outdoor Classroom Day possible.


